Over 100 members and friends attended the Chatsworth Hotel for the annual dinner dance with the disco attracting more general approval than previously.

The fund raising fiddle and The Milk Race draw both contributed handsomely to the financial successes of the year. Auctioneer Andy Lock's 50/50 sale raised £56 for the clubroom building fund which increased steadily during the twelvemonth - what we now need is a suitable building plot, so keep your eyes and ears open!
