## **British Cycling membership**

Last month the Newsletter had details of membership of 'Cycling UK' (formerly CTC) and mentioned that 'other cycling organisations are available'. Well the postman has just delivered a bundle of leaflets regarding 'British Cycling' and, as a special offer, they are offering discounted membership for those joining for the first time. There are different levels of membership dependent upon whether you want to race; a 'Ride Only' category, or just a 'fan'. You'll have to read the small print yourself but I suspect that the discount is for the first year only but, by way of example, 'Ride Only' for anyone born before 1999 is discounted from £39 down to £19.50 whilst 'Race Gold' is cut from £76 to £52. If you're interested, have a look at their website to check out the benefits. If you want to sign up, and you're a new member wanting to race, then use the promotion code NEWCMRA. If you're looking for 'Ride Only' membership, use the promotion code NEWCMRD. I have passed the leaflets on to Mick Irons if you need a copy.

### **Sports Direct**

Now, I don't go into Sports Direct every day so I never check on what stock they have or have not. I only know that they sell umbrellas at two for £6. Now that they have taken over the running of Evans Cycles, are we going to see a change in what they sell? This low-cost retailer was recently advertising some older Zipp clincher wheels on it's website at a discounted rate. A Zipp 404 Firecrest front wheel was reduced from £849.99 down to £599.99 and a set of Shimano Dura-Ace C50 9000 clincher wheels were available at £999.99 down from £1,499.99. It might be worth popping in there every so often just to see what they have. Their website has lots of bits and pieces marked as 'must go' so perhaps they're clearing existing stock to make way for 'proper' cycling kit?

### **Power Meters.**

Have we seen the last of power meters on professional road bikes? The UCI President and ASO, together with Tour de France director, Christian Prudhomme wants to outlaw power meters as they 'annihilate the glorious uncertainty of the sport.' He then stated that, without the use of a power meter, a rider would be blind to their effort, therefore bringing back the element of uncertainty. There's also talk of ditching radios for the riders. Is this just another attempt to de-rail the successes of Team Sky?

### **Derailleur gears**

Henri Desgrange, the originator of the Tour de France, didn't like derailleur gears. He reckoned that 'variable gears are only for people over forty-five.'

#### Paris - Roubaix
