WORTHING EXCELSIOR CYCLING CLUB SECRETARY'S REPORT 1978

Having just compiled a list of headings for this report, my first glance suggests that 1978, for the Excelsior, was <u>not</u> a year of innovation.

Thus our promotion of four events was reiterated:-

- a. the reliability trials, held on a very cold February day.
- b. the road race, sponsored by the Hastings and Thanet Building Society, was restricted to senior riders only and attracted a full field.
- c. the Ron Mills sponsored 25 mile time trial, in which we won the first team award.
- d. the Kermesse racing on the seafront, <u>again</u> ably promoted but, this year, suffering from a lack of entries.

On the social side we had a <u>further</u> helping of Theo's Christmas supper and the annual dinner-dance was <u>repeated</u> at the Royal Coach where one of the highlights was the excellent speech by ex-member Tony Hill.

Dave Hudson <u>resumed</u> his organisation of trips to Paris (finish of the Tour de France), Rotterdam (slight hitch - the six day race was one week later) and Harrogate (for a weekend visit to the cycle show and centenary celebrations).

Members were, <u>once more</u>, involved in manning a stand, complete with competition rollers at the local Chatsmore fete, and our support of the Worthing road safety quiz <u>recurred</u>, with four teams being entered.

A <u>further</u> programme of club runs was presented containing the popular mixture of evening soup runs, weekend motor-assisted runs together with the usual Sunday runs.

Fund raising activities were <u>continued</u> under the joint aegis of Theo and Dave, their combined efforts resulting in more than £300 for Club funds.

Our promotion of events on behalf of local cycling associations <u>remained</u> uninterrupted with the successful running of both the SCA 100 and the ESCA tourist trial - the former being organised by Ray Douglass and the latter being won by him.

Now for something completely <u>different</u> - three Club records were broken during the year, including two at 50 miles - the Club contributed towards the expenses incurred by our team, which competed in the National Championship 25 on Teeside - in January of this year a series of hardriders Sunday Club runs was inaugurated.
