LONDON to PARIS

Day 1

7am Blackheath and 150 cyclists were briefed on the journey ahead. I know now why there is a shortage of carbon, most of it was at Blackheath.! The first night's stop was to be in Calais.

A nice easy 90 miles on the hottest day of the year. One mile and Shooters Hill warmed the legs. The first 20 miles was busy, but the roads became clearer and we settled down to our own pace. After 48 miles a well organised lunch stop and then a big climb of 16%.

I arrived in Dover at 3.30pm, in plenty of time for the 6pm ferry. 30 riders missed it and had to catch a later one! After dinner and a cold beer on the boat we arrived in Calais. A hot bath, lashings of Deep Heat, dinner and bed. It had been a hard day, I'd never drunk so much water.

Day 2

75 miles to Abbeville, away by 8.30 and easily following the well signed route. The ride was more relaxed now on French country roads with cycle friendly drivers. Once again the temperature reached 35°, lots of water. Lunch again under canvas, Bars and Cafes were doing well on sales of beer or coffee. We arrived in Abbeville about 4pm, hot and tired, same routine – bath, Deep Heat, dinner and bed, with the addition of a few glasses of red wineOf course!!

Day 3

70 miles to Beauvais - Bikes checked, luggage loaded in a lorry for the next hotel, it was so well organised. We had a back-up vehicle and even a doctor on her bike who rode at the back to ensure the slow ones were OK, water stops every 15 to 20 miles if you needed, energy bars, bananas and fruit at all the stops.

Another hot day, lovely country roads through cornfields gently rolling with the odd climb, nothing too severe. We stopped in one or two or was it three Bars for refreshments! In the Beauvais hotel there was a swimming pool, so bikes were parked and we were soon in the water, it was bliss.

Day 4

To Paris, only 60 miles, the last 20 of which were through the suburbs. The plan was to lunch at 30 miles, ride on and re-group a mile from the Champs-Elysées and ride in together.

We did just that, 150 cyclists riding down the Champs – Elysées without stopping, not for any red light or car on the roundabouts, the French weren't expecting the Tour to arrive until the next day, Sunday, so we were cheered and clapped all the way to the Eiffel Tower, where we met another 150 riders who had come via Dieppe. What a sight, 300 now cheering and slapping each other on the back! The champagne was now flowing and many riders were met by family.

On the last night we stayed in one hotel and attended a dinner to celebrate the raising of £500,000 for Action Medical Research, who this year are funding research into premature babies.

A great experience, I may do it again one day.

CLUB ROAD RACE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Club Road Race Championship was held on the 25th July at the Goodwood Motor Race circuit. Sixty riders had signed on, with two competitors from the Club, Adrian and Jon Rodgers. The championship coincided with the Club's promotion at Goodwood, so

a number of club helpers were on hand for judging.

The weather was sunny, hot, with a light breeze, making for good racing conditions. As both Jon and Adrian were Fourth category riders they started in the first group, with the Third Second and First category groups starting about 1 – 2 minutes apart. Adrian scored the first Club success taking first Prime on lap 3. The chasing group caught up with the lead group with 7 laps to go, injecting increasing speed into the lead group. Adrian was in the main bunch with Jon tracking him closely behind. A small breakaway group tried to get away but did not get further than a minute lead, before finally being pulled back

A final breakaway group of 9 First category riders went off the front of the group and stayed away. Adrian and Jon were in the main bunch still keeping an eye on each other, as the speed went up again with the leading group being chased down.

For the Club competition, the final sprint went to Adrian, powering across the line, finishing in the first 20 overall. Jon came in close behind in the first 30 riders. With the first Club rider across the line being the winner of the Road Race Championship, Adrian Rodgers is the 2006 champion.
